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Infamous (adjective)

Hindi Meaning:

English Meaning: Well known for some bad quality or deed, not respectable

Usage: He is infamous for saying that cheating is the way the game is played.

Synonyms: Disreputable, discreditable, ignominious, louche, disgraceful, despicable, detestable

Disreputable (adj.)

not trusted or respected; thought to have a bad character:

Usage: Some of the more disreputable newspapers made false claims about her private life.

Discreditable (adj.)

causing or likely to cause a loss of respect for a person, group, or idea:

Usage: Their tactics were highly discreditable.

Ignominious (adj.)

(especially of events or behaviour) embarrassing because of being a complete failure:

Usage: an ignominious defeat/failure/retreat

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louche (adj.)

not completely moral or honest, often in an attractive way:

A louche young man approached her on the dance floor.

Disgraceful (adj.)

very bad:

She thought that their attitude was absolutely disgraceful.

Despicable (adj.)

very unpleasant or bad, causing strong feelings of dislike:

despicable behaviour

It was despicable of her to lie about her friend.

Detestable (adj.)

used to refer to people or things that you hate very much:

a detestable coward

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Antonyms: Reputable, honorable, decent, commendable, ethical

Commendable (adj.)

deserving praise:

commendable efforts/behaviour/bravery

Ethical (adj.)

relating to beliefs about what is morally right and wrong:

ethical and legal issues

Vivid (adjective)

Hindi Meaning:

English Meaning: Bright and clear, producing powerful feelings or images in mind or very brightly coloured:

Usage: He has vivid memories of his trip to Tajpur.

She was wearing a vivid pink shirt.

Synonyms: Visual, delineated, graphic, depicted, expressive, pictorial

Delineate (verb)

to describe or mark the edge of something:

Usage: The main characters are clearly delineated in the first chapter.

Graphic (adj.)

very clear and powerful:

a graphic description/account

Usage: He insisted on describing his operation in graphic detail while we were eating lunch.

Depict (verb)

to represent or show something in a picture or story:

Usage: Her paintings depict the lives of ordinary people in the last century.

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Antonyms: Indeterminate, vague, obscure, unclear, hazy

Indeterminate (adj.)

not measured, counted, or clearly known:

An indeterminate number of workers have already been exposed to the danger.

Vague (adj.)

not clearly expressed, known, described, or decided:

I do have a vague memory of meeting her many years ago.

Obscure (adj.)

not clear and difficult to understand or see:

Official policy has changed, for reasons that remain obscure.

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Obscure (verb)

to prevent something from being seen or heard:

The sun was obscured by clouds.

Hazy (adj.)

not clear or not remembering things clearly:

hazy memories of childhood

Deplete (verb)

Hindi Meaning:

English Meaning: To reduce something in size or amount like money , resources.... Etc.

Usage: It we continue to deplete the earth's natural resources, we will cause serious damage to the environment.

Synonyms: Absorb, consume, exhaust, drain, abate, debilitate, expend, spend

Exhaust (verb)

1. to make someone extremely tired:

The long journey exhausted the children.

2. to use something completely:

Usage: How long will it be before the world's fuel supplies are exhausted?

Usage: I'm afraid he's exhausted my patience.

Drain (verb)

1. to make someone very tired:

The long journey completely drained me.

2. to reduce or cause something to reduce:

The long war had drained the resources of both countries.

Abate (verb)

1 to become less strong, or to make something less strong:

Our desire for consumer goods has not abated.

2. if something such as a price or level abates, it goes up more slowly than before, or it goes down:

Gains in oil prices are unlikely to abate within the next few months.

Debilitate (verb)

to make someone or something physically weak:

Chemotherapy exhausted and debilitated him.

Expend (verb)

to use or spend time, effort, or money:

You expend so much effort for so little return.

Antonyms: Renew, augment, enlarge, strengthen, enforce

Augment (verb)

to increase the size or value of something by adding something to it:

He would have to find work to augment his income.

Enlarge (verb)

to become bigger or to make something bigger:

They've enlarged the kitchen by building over part of the garden.

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Enforce (verb)

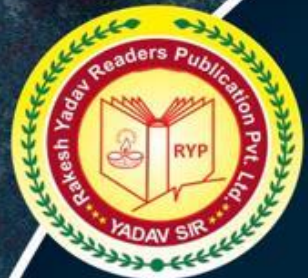
to give force to : **STRENGTHEN** OR to make people obey a law, or to make a particular situation happen or be accepted:

The new teacher had failed to enforce any sort of discipline.
