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Levity (noun)

Hindi Meaning: छिछोरापन/चंचलता

English Meaning: Lack of seriousness

Usage: It was inappropriate to her to insert some levity into the funeral.

Synonyms: Silliness, flightiness, flippancy, frivolity, frothiness, festivity, gaiety

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Flightiness (noun)

lacking stability or the quality of not being responsible and being likely to change activities, jobs, partners, etc.

Usage: *She could recognize the flightiness of her mother's temper.*

Flippancy (noun) the quality of not being serious

Usage: *This is not the time for flippancy.*

Frivolity (noun)

behaviour that is silly and not serious

Usage: *You shouldn't treat such a serious subject with frivolity.*

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Frothiness (noun) Frothy (adj.)

entertaining and easily understood, but not serious or intended to make you think:

Usage: Her first novel was a frothy romantic comedy.

Festivity (noun)

the parties, meals, and other social activities with which people celebrate a special occasion **OR** a situation in which people are happy and celebrating

Usage: Come in and join the festivities!

Gaiety (noun)

happiness and excitement:

Usage: She loved the gaiety of the holiday season.

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Antonyms: Seriousness, gravity, solemnness, solemnity, soberness

Gravity (noun)

1. the force that attracts objects towards one another

The laws of gravity

2. seriousness:

I don't think you understand the gravity of the situation.

Solemnness (noun) OR Solemnity (noun)/ Solemn (adj.)

the quality of being serious: Solemn face

You should understand the solemnity of a funeral service.

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Soberness (noun)/ Sober (Adj.)

1st meaning not drunk or affected by alcohol

***Usage:* Are you sober enough to drive**

2nd meaning serious and calm

***Usage:* was in a very sober mood**

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Next Step

Amiable (adjective)

Hindi Meaning: सुशील/प्रिय/प्रेमपात्र

English Meaning: Pleasant and friendly

Usage: So amiable was the mood of the meeting that a decision was soon reached.

Synonyms: Affable, agreeable, genial, gracious, mellow, amicable, cordial, benign, sociable, amenable

Affable (adj)

friendly and easy to talk to:

She was quite affable at the meeting.

Genial (adj.)

friendly and pleasant:

The teacher is very genial/has a genial manner.

Gracious (adj.)

behaving in a pleasant, polite, calm way:

The losing team was gracious in defeat.

Mellow (adj.)

relaxed and pleasant or not severe:

a mellow mood/atmosphere

After a few drinks, he became very mellow.

Amicable (adj.)

relating to behaviour between people that is pleasant and friendly, often despite a difficult situation:

His manner was perfectly amicable, but I felt uncomfortable.

Cordial (adj.)

friendly, but formal and polite:

a cordial smile/greeting/welcome/reception

benign (adj.)

pleasant and kind:

a benign old lady

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amenable (adj.)

willing to accept or be influenced by a suggestion:

***Do you think the new manager will prove more
amenable to our proposals?***

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Antonyms: Disagreeable, unamiable, ungenial, unpleasant, ill-tempered

Unpleasant (adj.)

not enjoyable or pleasant: or rude and angry:

When we complained, the waiter got very unpleasant with us.

ill-tempered

easily annoyed or If an occasion, such as a game, is ill-tempered, people get angry during it:

An increasingly ill-tempered match saw three players sent off before half-time.

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Next Step

Homogeneous (adjective)

Hindi Meaning: एक-रूप

English Meaning: Of the same kind , alike, people that are similar to each other

Usage: The population of the village has remained remarkably homogeneous.

Synonyms: Unchanging, cognate, connate, resemblant, commensurate, congenial, congeneric

Cognate (adj.)

Cognate languages and words have the same origin, or are related and in some way similar:

The Italian word "mangiare" (= to eat) is cognate with the French "manger".

Connate (adj.)

1st meaning related in nature or being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics or of similar parts or organs; closely joined or united

2nd Meaning

**existing in a person or thing from birth or origin; inborn:
a connate sense of right and wrong.**

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Resemblant (adj.)

marked by or showing resemblance. (a point of likeness : SIMILARITY)

commensurate (adj.)

***in a correct and suitable amount compared to something else:
a salary that is commensurate with skills and experience***

congenial (adj.)

***pleasant and friendly; producing a feeling of comfort or satisfaction:
We spent a relaxed evening with congenial friends.***

Congeneric (adj.) Congener (noun)

a person, organism, or thing resembling another in nature or action

Antonyms: Disparate, distinct, imprecise, diverse, unlike

Disparate (adj.)

different in every way:

The two cultures were so disparate that she found it hard to adapt from one to the other.

Distinct (adj.)

clearly separate and different (from something else):

The two concepts are quite distinct (from each other).

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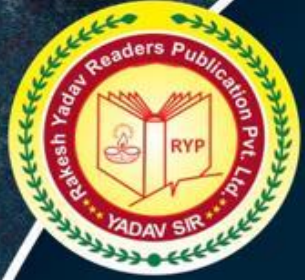
Imprecise (adj.)

not accurate or exact:

The figures are imprecise because they're based on a prediction of next year's sales.

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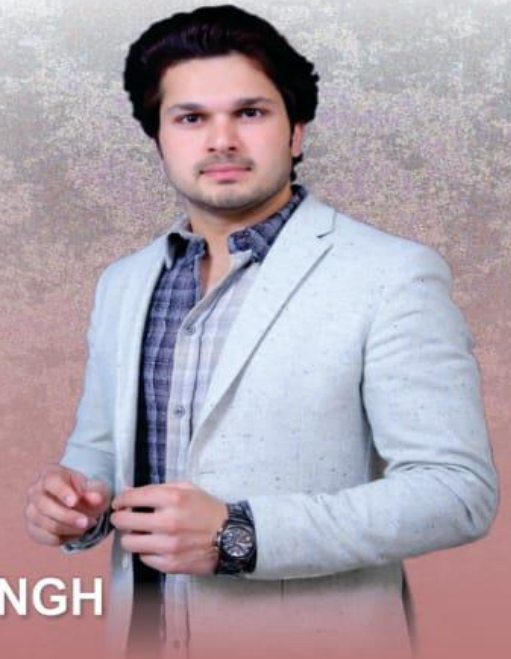
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
