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Oblivion (noun)

Hindi Meaning: भूल जाना/विस्मरण

English Meaning:

1st meaning: The state of being completely forgotten

2nd meaning: the state of being completely destroyed

Usage: Until the singer's recent hit, his career had fallen into a state of oblivion.

Usage: These toys will be around for a year or two, then fade/slide/sink into oblivion.

Usage: The planes bombed the city into oblivion.

Synonyms: Forgetfulness, unconsciousness blackout, ignorance, insensibility, unfamiliarity blackout (noun)

1st meaning: the action taken to make certain that information about something is not reported to the public:

Usage: a news blackout

2nd **meaning:** a short period when someone suddenly becomes unconscious:

Usage: He can't drive because he suffers from blackouts.

3rd meaning: a period of time when electric power has failed

Usage: A blackout ended the game early.

Insensibility (noun)

the state of being unconscious or the fact of not caring about something or being unwilling or unable to react to it: usage: He was beaten into insensibility.

Antonyms: Recall, remembrance, alertness, cognizance, consciousness

Recall (verb)

to bring the memory of a past event into your mind or to cause you to think of a particular event/situation

usage: His paintings recall the style of Picasso.

remembrance (noun)

1st meaning: the act of remembering and showing respect for someone who has died or a past event:

A church service was held in remembrance of the victims.

2nd meaning: a memory of something that happened in the past:

usage: Sweet remembrances

Cognizance (noun)

to take notice of and consider something, especially when judging: usage: The lawyer asked the jury to take cognizance of the defendant's generosity in giving to charity.

consciousness (noun) the state of understanding and realizing something: usage: Her consciousness that she's different makes her feel uneasy.

Discursive (Adjective)

Hindi Meaning: असंबद्ध

English Meaning: Moving from one topic to another randomly, longer than necessary OR talking about subjects that are only slightly connected

Usage: His discursive speech was hard to follow.

Synonyms: Desultory, rambling, excursive, digression, leaping, maundering, deviating

Desultory (adj.)

without a clear plan or purpose and showing little effort or interest:

usage: She made a desultory attempt at conversation.

Rambling (adj.)

too long and confused: a long rambling speech excursive (adj.)

often moving away from the main subject

Usage: Long excursive passages interrupt the logical progression of the argument.

digression (Noun)

the action of moving away from the main subject

Usage: Talking about money now would be a digression from

the main purpose of this meeting.

Leaping/Leap (verb)

1st meaning: to make a large jump or sudden movement, usually from one place to another:

Usage: He leaped out of his car and ran towards the house.

2nd meaning: to provide help, protection, etc. very quickly:

Usage: He leaped to his friend's defence.

3rd meaning: to grow or to achieve something suddenly, usually fame, power, or importance:

Usage: He leapt to fame after his appearance in a Broadway play.

Maundering (adj.)

Confused and long or lasting for a long time: usage: Even an actor with twice his vitality would be hard put to infuse feeling into the maundering dialogue.

Deviate (verb)

to change from the usual way, or to go in a different direction: usage: He never deviated from his strict vegetarian diet.

Antonyms: Logical, coherent, consistent, focused, straight forward

Coherent (adj.)

1st meaning: If an argument, set of ideas, or a plan is coherent,
It is clear and carefully considered, and each part of it connects or follows in a natural or reasonable way.

2nd meaning:

If someone is coherent, you can understand what that person says: When she calmed down, she was more coherent. (=able to speak clearly and be understood).

Consistent (adj.)

always behaving or happening in a similar, especially positive, way:

There has been a consistent improvement in her attitude.

Duplicity (Noun)

Hindi Meaning: कपट/दोहरी चाल

English Meaning: Dishonest talk or behaviour, double-dealing Usage: They were accused of duplicity in their dealings with both sides.

Synonyms: Deceitfulness, cunning, deceptiveness, dissembling, guile, craftiness, cozenage

Deceitfulness (noun)

the action of keeping the truth hidden, especially to get an advantage:

Only he seemed to have recognised Lucy's deceitfulness.

Cunning (adj.)

Cunning people are clever at planning something so that they get what they want, especially by tricking other people

He's a very cunning man.

Deceptiveness (noun)

the quality of making you believe something that is not true:

We will not accept deceptiveness from politicians.

Dissembling/Dissemble (verb)

to hide your real intentions and feelings or the facts:

He accused the government of dissembling.

Guile (noun)

clever but sometimes dishonest behaviour that you use to deceive someone:

The president will need to use all her political guile to stay in power.

Craftiness (noun)

behaviour that is clever, and sometimes also slightly dishonest: She gets her way by a mixture of craftiness and determination.

Cozenage (noun)

the practice of deception

I have read many stories of cozenage.

Antonyms: Good faith, guilelessness, sincerity, reliability, virtuousness

Reliability (noun)

the quality of being able to be trusted

Their cars are famous for their quality and reliability.

Virtuousness (noun)

the quality of doing what is right and avoiding what is wrong.

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
